We are so excited that you decided to join us and help save lions and other endangered wildlife species. You have taken a huge first step by downloading this presentation.


Don't worry, we will guide you through the process step-by-step so it will be super easy to do!

presentations just like this one.




At first,

# Here is everything you need to know:




The presentation is a slide show of 14 slides. Most slides will have a photo or a mind map and a few bullet points with lion facts. The first and the last slide also have a link to a video that you just click on and the video will play automatically. Don't worry, it will be very clear when to click these links.



There are note cards in Attachment 1 that you can print out. They will give you all the information you will need to understand what the image on each slide means. While your audience is looking at the image on the slide, you can read what is on the note cards, or use your own words to explain the image on each slide. It will be very clear which note cards go with which slide.



You may want to practice giving the presentation to your family or a few friends, or just look through the slideshow and notes. We practised too and our parents and siblings loved listening to us. It doesn't matter if you make mistakes, everyone is just proud of you for taking action for a great cause! We realized that we speak too fast when we are presenting and we have to keep telling ourselves to talk s l o o w! This is a lot of information and you must speak slowly so your audience can follow what you're saying.



You are now all ready and good to go! Set up a laptop so that your audience can see the slides. If you have a white board in your class, connect the laptop to the white board and make sure you know how to get to the next slides. Maybe ask your teacher or a friend to help you click through the slides while you present.
